Name of Course/Course Code: Grade 10 academic history (CHC 2DF)

Course Prerequisite: None

Course Description: This course explores social, economic, and political developments and events and their impact on the lives of different groups in Canada since 1914. Students will examine the role of conflict and cooperation in Canadian society, Canada's evolving role within the global community, and the impact of various individuals, organizations, and events on Canadian identity, citizenship, and heritage. They will develop their ability to apply the concepts of historical thinking and the historical inquiry process, including the interpretation and analysis of evidence, when investigating key issues and events in Canadian history since 1914.

Catholic Graduate Expectations: One of the strongest themes found in the teachings of the Catholic Church concerns social justice. This course presents students with historic issues faced by Canadians and interprets them in light of the gospel teachings. Students recognize that there are certain gospel values such as social justice values that transcend history and are still relevant for the future. Students recognize that the story of Canada is not simply dates, events, and personalities but also the struggle to incorporate values in the face of rapid changes and challenges.
